Please note skirts should be a maximum of 10 cm above the knee. Longer length skirts are available from the official school suppliers by special request.

Trousers can be 'slim' but not 'skinny'. Denim trousers are not allowed and trousers should not have studs on the pockets in a jeans style.



Shoes should be polishable. Black trainers or canvas shoes are not allowed.

Polo shirts may be worn in the summer term or a shirt and tie. During the autumn and spring terms only shirts and ties are allowed, with a school jumper or cardigan.
