

Key Stage 4 Curriculum and Assessment – Guidance for Parents

Curriculum Structure

Currently we run a three year key stage 4. Pupils in year 9 have opted for four subjects alongside the core curriculum, which comprises of English, Mathematics, Science, Welsh, PSE, RVE, Games and Skills. Each option has four hours per fortnight of curriculum time.

Internal Assessment

Throughout the year class teachers will assess the progress of pupils using a variety of methods. This may include the use of;

- Key classwork tasks
- Homework tasks
- Tests
- Performance in elements of Non-Examination Assessments (previously referred to as coursework/controlled assessments)
- Internal examinations
- Results for external examinations

The dates of these internal assessments will vary from class to class. Pupils will be made aware of these and are encouraged to record the dates and inform you. For years 9 & 10 there will be internal examinations held in June. For year 10 subjects which have an external unit in the summer of year 10, and all year 11 subjects, 'mock' examinations will be held in the spring term.

External Examinations

Prior to external examinations pupils/parents will be asked to check the entries made and will receive a timetable of the examinations, including the venue, date and time. The individual timetables can only be provided once pupils have been entered for the examinations. For the summer series this information is given in March/April. Information on dates for each examination series is available on the WJEC website Key Dates & Timetables | WJEC.

At the end of this document a summary of the units for each subject is given along with approximate dates for external assessments and NEAs (previously known as coursework). Detailed information regarding the assessment structure for each subject is given by individual subjects. Further information course structure can be found on the WJEC website.

Tracking periods

There are four tracking points within the academic year plus one full report. For all tracking periods pupils will be given a score (1-4) on their attitude to learning and effort and completion of tasks.

For tracking 2 and 4 you will be given a current predicted grade (A*-G). This is the grade the teacher believes the child will achieve based on current performance. After each tracking period interim reports will be electronically sent to parents.

- Comments and areas for improvement: Subject specific comments about progress, areas of strength and advice about how the pupil can make further progress in the future.
